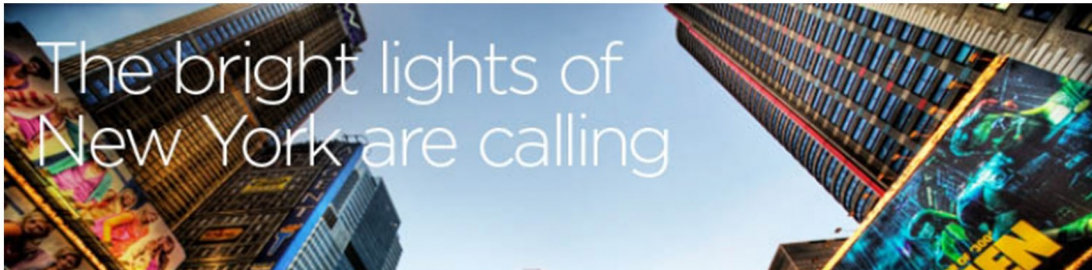

The must sees

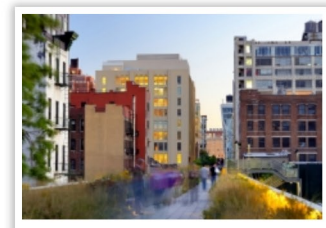
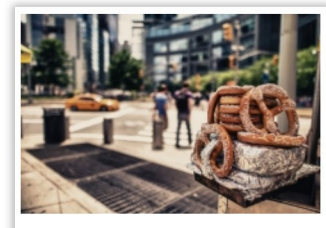
There are dozens of must sees, but consider some canny alternatives. For example, visit The Top of the Rock (the observatory atop 30 Rockefeller Plaza): it has shorter queues than the Empire State Building and has views of Central Park. Book early for Broadway shows, or queue on the day at the TKTS ticket booth (www.tdf.org) for massive discounts on daily events.

Local delicacies

New York has more Michelin star restaurants than any US city, but before you hit the good stuff, be sure and sample some more traditional fare: like a bagel from Ess-a-bagel, a pretzel in Central Park, or "have what she's having" at Katz Delicatessen, the diner immortalised in *When Harry Met Sally*. Then treat your palate to world-class Japanese cuisine at Masa; French-American fusion at Jean-Georges; or a multi-course tasting menu at Eleven Madison Park: all awarded three Michelin stars.

A great place to watch the world go by

For sublime people watching The High Line is the place to be, a public park built on a former rail line above the streets on the West Side. The gardens, water features and benches offer an oasis from the bustle below, running an impressive 18 blocks from north to south.
